MONDY LARIZ APPOINTED EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mondy Lariz has been appointed Executive Director of the Stevens & Permanente Creeks Watershed Council (SPCWC), Chairman Gary Bailey announced today.

The council's executive committee reached unanimous consensus on this appointment which promotes Mr. Lariz from Watershed Coordinator to Executive Director and their recommendation was ratified today at a meeting of the full council.

Bailey said that Mondy had been serving as Watershed Coordinator for the last three years while also performing the duties of an Executive Director. His appointment will be effective immediately.

"Mondy has demonstrated outstanding administrative leadership in previous positions, and during the period that he directed the operations of the council, SPCWC is proud to have a person of his caliber to provide staff leadership in this time of rapid growth. He will assure the continuation of our watershed projects as well as finding new opportunities for the council. However, his primary responsibility will be to complete the design for a self sustaining funding program," Bailey stated.

"Providing a reliable source of funding for this organization is of paramount importance, Lariz said. I look forward to building our capacity through partnerships with both the public and private sectors while continuing to seek grant funding for important watershed projects."
